



Screening checks are now monitored.

Starting 1 July 2017, the DCSI Screening Unit will monitor new information that may change the clearance status of individuals.

Why the change?

The new screening system has been introduced to help reduce the risk of harm to children and vulnerable people.

Until now, screening only reviewed and assessed an individual's relevant history once every three years, the new system will monitor information to help better protect children and vulnerable people.

How will it work?




New information from SA Police (SAPOL) and the Department for Child Protection (DCP) will be used by the DCSI Screening Unit to ensure individual clearances are current.

- Only relevant information, including offences will be used to reassess clearances.
- Only individuals with a current valid DCSI clearance will be monitored.

If a reassessment changes the clearance status of an individual:

- the individual and their employer (who requested the screening) will be notified
- the individual will need to return their clearance letter to the DCSI Screening Unit.
